

The skin is a lot more **complex**<sup>1</sup> and **fascinating**<sup>2</sup> than most people realize. It's the body's largest **organ**<sup>3</sup>, making up roughly 16 percent of a person's total weight, and it is **constantly**<sup>4</sup> **transforming**<sup>5</sup>. New cells **replace**<sup>6</sup> dead ones at a phenomenal rate. In fact, the **surface**<sup>7</sup> of your skin is covered by a thin layer of dead skin. You often see this dead skin <u>flaking off</u> your body. An enormous amount of **shedding**<sup>8</sup> of this dead skin and **generation**<sup>9</sup> of new cells <u>takes place</u>. It's been **estimated**<sup>10</sup> that the skin **essentially**<sup>11</sup> renews itself every 28 days.

## The Layers of the Skin


There are three main layers of the skin. The first is the **epidermis**<sup>12</sup>, or surface of the skin. The second layer is the dermis, which is under the epidermis. Finally, the third layer is known as the **subcutaneous**<sup>13</sup> layer.



## $\mathcal{T}_{\mathsf{he}\;\mathsf{Epidermis}}$

This **topmost**<sup>14</sup> layer of your skin is made up of several smaller layers. As **mentioned**<sup>15</sup> earlier, the skin is covered in dead cells. These dead cells make up the **outermost** 16 region of the epidermis called the stratum corneum. Under this layer is the stratum lucidum, which is Latin for "clear layer." The stratum lucidum is also made up of dead cells. It gets its name from the fact it is translucent under a **microscope**<sup>17</sup>. Other components of the epidermis include the stratum granulosum. This **element**<sup>18</sup> **contains**<sup>19</sup> granules that help with hydration. The epidermis also contains the stratum spinosum and the stratum basale, the bottom layer of the epidermis. It is in the stratum basale where skin cells divide. In other words, the cells reproduce and push up the newly formed cells into the layers above.

## $\mathcal{T}_{\mathsf{he}\;\mathsf{Dermis}}$

In contrast to the epidermis, the **underlying**<sup>20</sup> dermis is wholly made up of living cells. The thickest of the three main layers of the skin, it contains a **multitude**<sup>21</sup> of sensory nerve endings and **blood vessels**<sup>22</sup>. Nutrients are also carried by these blood vessels, and the vessels take away waste as well. In addition , the dermis contains oil glands, called sebaceous glands. These glands regularly produce a substance known as sebum,


a natural **lubricant**<sup>23</sup> for your body. Sebum also acts as a form of waterproofing<sup>24</sup> for your body; without it, your skin would



**absorb**<sup>25</sup> too much water. Other elements of the dermis (and epidermis) are sweat glands. Humans sweat all the time. The perspiration is **excreted**<sup>26</sup> through tiny holes in the skin called pores. Sweat glands help the body maintain a comfortable temperature.

The Subcutaneous Layer

Made up **primarily**<sup>27</sup> of fat cells, this bottom layer of the skin helps the body keep warm. It acts somewhat like a **shock absorber**<sup>28</sup>, protecting us when we **bump**<sup>29</sup> our arms or fall down. It's also to this layer that the roots of hair follicles reach (the head has over 100,000 hair follicles).



Clearly, the skin plays **crucial**<sup>30</sup> roles in helping to <u>protect</u> us <u>from</u> outside invaders and regulating our temperature. In addition, it is **self-lubricating**<sup>31</sup> and renews and **nourishes**<sup>32</sup> itself constantly. **Marvelous**<sup>33</sup>, isn't it?




