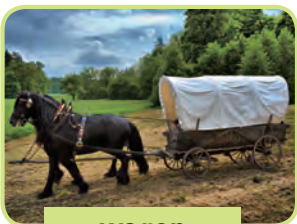

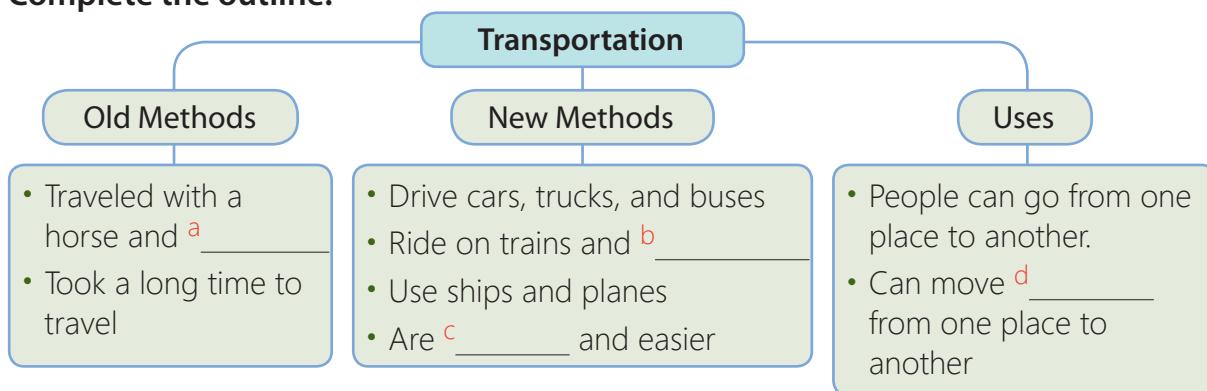

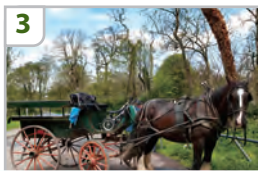

Graham Bell.

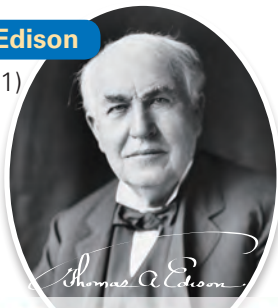

George Washington was the first president of the United States. Americans call him "the father of our country."
