


be eight to five, so you need to sign in before eight o'clock on your first day. You will have one hour for lunch each day.

Hospital Staff: Doctors 醫療人員:醫生



If a doctor treats a wide range of conditions in patients of either sex and any age, we call him a **general practitioner** (GP). If a doctor specializes in a particular type of medicine, we add the suffix -ist to his or her specialty. For example, a doctor working in urology is known as a **urologist**.

There are exceptions to this rule, however. For example, a doctor who treats children is called a **pediatrician**, not a pediatrist.

如果醫師診治廣泛的症狀,且其醫病對象不分男女老少,我們稱其為**家醫科醫師**(GP)。如果醫師專攻特定科別,我們會以該醫師專精的科別原文後方加上字根「-ist」。舉例而言,泌尿科(urology)醫師的原文就是urologist。

不過也有例外的情況,例如小兒科醫師的稱 謂就是 pediatrician,而非 pediatrist。



The **pharmacy** is an important place in the hospital. Pharmacists sell medications to patients, but they also offer important advice about side effects of medicines and explain when and how the drugs should be taken. When you are given a **prescription** by a doctor, you usually take it to the pharmacy. Without a prescription, you can't buy many medications. A pharmacy is also known as a *drugstore* or *chemist*.

There are many forms of medication. The most common type is **tablets**, which are swallowed by the patient. The shape and size of tablets vary widely. Tablets are also known as *pills*.

Medications are also given as **injections**, or *shots*. Injected medication is typically delivered directly to the blood stream with a **syringe**.

Nasal sprays are used to inject medicine directly to the nasal passages. Asthma **inhalers** deliver medicine directly to the mouth, and the medicine is breathed in.

藥局是醫院裡的重鎮,藥劑師負責售予藥物給患者,也提供藥物的重要資訊如副作用,並向患者解釋藥物的服用方式和時機。醫師開立處方箋後,你通常會帶著處方箋到藥局。若沒有處方箋,就無法購得許多藥物。藥局的英文別稱又叫做「drugstore」或「chemist」。

藥物的形式眾多,最常見的就是患者可吞服的錠劑, 錠劑藥物的形狀與大小各異,亦可稱為藥丸。

另一種形式就是注射,亦可稱為打針。注射式藥物通 常會透過注射器直接將藥物輸送至血管。

鼻噴劑可將藥物直接噴往鼻腔,氣喘吸入劑則能將藥 物直接送往口腔,以吸氣的方式吸收藥物。
